

The European Institute of Innovation and Technology

This autumn an exciting new institute will be opened to foster the development of innovative technologies across the European Union. The headquarters of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) will be based in Budapest, Hungary after a competitive bid by the city knocked out other potential candidates and proved its ample ability to host the institution. With this choice, the EU's progressive advancement into the New Member states can clearly be observed and hopefully will encourage further increased scientific and technological activity in the region.

The principal aims of the institute highlight innovation, sustainable growth, and the competitiveness of the European technological sector worldwide. Emphasizing the need to address contemporary concerns and challenges, the institute should be a valuable source for a wide variety of stakeholders, including business interests, citizens, innovators, policy makers, researchers, and scientists. By concentrating the wealth of knowledge from these sources, EIT will further contribute to the EU's fundamental role as an established and creative member

of the Global Information Society. EIT will bolster the strength of EU higher education and even contribute by offering master and doctorate degrees with an "EIT" label.

To improve the education system and benefit from universities' knowledge, EIT will encourage collaboration between the education sector and research oriented bodies, including private and public organizations.

The structure of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology should ensure flexibility to avoid bureaucratic obstacles and support the aims of the institute. An independent board with representatives from academia and the business communities will govern the EIT. The operations of the EIT themselves will be undertaken by the best businesses, research centers and universities through the creation of Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs). Currently a call for the first 2 or 3 KICs has been published and is accessible at the following website:

These partnerships will utilize the collaboration of members from the education, technology, research, and business fields. The call for KICs closes this August and proposals will be evaluated this fall. The first several KICs will be selected by December and the EIT is expected to be operational by early 2010.

Through an initial contribution from the EU of 308.7 million EUR, the foundation will be laid for developing a

premier European research institute that utilizes the market's interest in discovering cutting-edge technologies. By encouraging the private sector to partake and invest in the EIT, the expectation is that the institute will be able to primarily propagate its activities with these private resources. Additional support will be supplied through Community funded programmes, various states, international bodies/institutions, loans from the European Investment Bank and finally from the generation of revenue from its own profit-oriented actions.

The EIT should be an excellent opportunity for the European Community to advance its products, services, and technologies with respects to innovation and compete on a global scale as one of the finest research institutions. Certainly, this will be a valuable resource for those involved in the field of technological innovations. For further details,

Seeking greater input from the business community, the European Commission is garnering information from an independent business panel to contribute to the new Innovation Plan for Europe. Aimed at opening communication and developing a strategy to enhance innovative technologies usage, a website was constructed

which discusses the various elements necessary to promote innovation. Subjects covered include the expanding the definition of innovation, investments in future infrastructure, and increasing the speed, funding and space for innovation. Results from the proactive online debate will be published in fall of this year.

The European Inventor Award

Proposals are now being accepted (until 12 September 2009) for determining the European Inventor Awards of 2010. An annual award, emphasizing the uniqueness and contributions from a progressive patent, is available in four categories: Industry, SMEs/Research, Lifetime Achievement, and Non-European countries. The objective is to offer recognition and propagate the accomplished innovations of keen individuals energizing the European knowledge society.

Incorporating Mobile Learning into Mainstream Education

Funded by the Leonardo da Vinci sectoral programme of the Lifelong Learning Programme, this project introduced mobile learning technologies into mainstream education and training. Mobile learning is the use of commonplace technologies, like PDAs and mobile phones, in enhancing educational opportunities. Building on the foundation previous studies had set about mobile learning, this project focused on incorporating the technology into the mainstream of the educational system.

Memento: Sharing Memories and Culture Through Arts

The Memento project allowed for collaboration between different groups of peoples interested in expressing their local customs and identities through artistic creations. New methods of learning were discovered and utilized to foster an embracive yearning for adult education. The project was funded by the Grundtvig sub-programme of the Lifelong Learning Programme.
